# THE SCHOOL FOR LIES TAKES WICKED AIM AT THE FOIBLES OF CONTEMPORARY SOCIETY IN A NAUGHTY, BAWDY COMEDY PREMIERING AT NORTH COAST REP

Playwright David Ives (*Venus in Fur*) pulls out all the stops in a deliciously witty, over-the-top farce, *THE SCHOOL FOR LIES*, a San Diego premiere presented by North Coast Repertory Theatre. As in Molière's *The Misanthrope* upon which it is based, the elaborately costumed characters play out their decadent lives in elegant 17<sup>th</sup> century French drawing rooms. However, the situations and scandals are decidedly 21<sup>st</sup> century — frivolous lawsuits, sleazy lawyers, flip-flops, and rock 'n roll —to name a few. In a stunning display of verbal acrobatics, Ives has his scheming, gossiping characters speak in hilarious rhyming couplets that will leave the audience weak with laughter as they anticipate the zinger that always comes. Be prepared for an evening of unabashed merriment.

Andrew Paul will direct a cast that includes Richard Baird\*, Brenda Dodge, Jason Heil\*, Dana Hooley, Jessica John, Phil Johnson\*, David McBean\*, Jonathan McMurtry\* and Joel Ripka\*. ### **BACKGROUND:**

North Coast Repertory Theatre's 2013-2014 -Season 32 runs September 4, 2013, through August 3, 2014. Up next is a world premiere, MANDATE MEMORIES, featuring Apollo Dukakis and Rosina Reynolds playing from April 9 to May 4. In this taut and witty drama filled with revelations of love affairs, dreams and the founding of Israel, layers are peeled away to reveal the deep hearts of two caring and compassionate human beings. There is a mysterious connection between Gustav Frolich, an 80-year-old Holocaust survivor and Jane Stirling, a 62-year-old English widow as their debate reveals how different and yet how similar they are. By the author of Halpern and Johnson, Lionel Goldstein once again takes us deep into the hearts of two fascinating characters. Our second world premiere of the season, FADED GLORY previews on May 28 and runs till June 22. Meet Daniel Sickles, a 19th-century congressman, friend to presidents, Civil War general, lover of Queen Isabella of Spain, notorious philanderer, embezzler, murderer, and the officer who almost cost the Union victory in perhaps the most pivotal battle of the Civil War, only to receive the Congressional Medal of Honor. Based on this real figure from American history, funny, poignant and filled with astonishing little-known historical information, FADED GLORY promises to be a highlight of our season. Audiences will enjoy a rollicking comedic romp through this amazing life. The season will end with ROMANCE/ROMANCE beginning on July 9 to August 3. Frothy and fun, this musical reminds us of those secret, frivolous, and embarrassing romantic impulses to which we are susceptible. In this rousing two-act musical we take a varied look at romance seekers in two ways: from a delightful romp through the sexual ennui of the turn of the century Vienna in the first act, to a second act modern look at affection and disaffection in a summer house in the Hamptons. He is otherwise perhaps best known for his evenings of one-act comedies All In The Timing (winner of the Outer Critics Circle Playwriting Award) and Time Flies. Other plays include New Jerusalem: The Interrogation of Baruch de Spinoza (winner of the Hull-Warriner Award); The Liar (adapted from Corneille, and winner of the Charles MacArthur Award); The Heir Apparent (adapted from J-F. Regnard); Is He Dead? (adapted from Mark Twain); Ancient History, and Polish Joke. His translation/adaptation of Alexis Piron's The Metromaniacs will appear in Washington D.C. at the Shakespeare Theatre next season. He is a former Guggenheim Fellow in playwriting and lives in New York City.

Andrew Paul (Director) is pleased to helm his first production at North Coast Rep. He is the co-founder and, with his colleague Mark Clayton Southers, the co-producing artistic director of THE PHOENIX, a project-based company in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where he recently directed Joe Penhall's Blue/Orange. Andrew previously co-founded the acclaimed Pittsburgh Irish & Classical Theatre (PICT) and served as the company's producing artistic director from 1996 to 2013. Under his leadership, PICT produced more than a hundred plays, festivals devoted to the plays of Samuel Beckett, J. M. Synge, Harold Pinter, and Anton Chekhov, and two successful international tours. Other PICT directing credits include Shakespeare's Hamlet, Henry IV, and Julius Caesar, the world premier of Thomas Kilroy's Henry(after Pirandello), Chekhov's The Seagull and Uncle Vanya, Brian Friel's Faith Healer and Aristocrats, and David Hare's Stuff Happens and Via Dolorosa. Andrew's 2002 production of Friel's Faith Healer starring Bingo O'Malley played to acclaim at thirteen venues in Ireland and Northern Ireland. In 2008, he directed and collaborated with David Hare on the non-English language premier of Stuff Happens at the Slaski Theatre in Katowice, Poland. He has taught acting at Duquesne University and directing at Carnegie Mellon University, has served as a panelist for Theatre Communications Group and the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, and is a proud board member of Pittsburgh Playwrights Theatre. In 2010, Andrew was a featured speaker at the World Theatre Conference in Baku, Azerbaijan. He lives in Las Vegas, Nevada with his wife, Maria, and children, Cristina and Alexander.
